The Institute of Medical Science seeks one Junior Teaching Assistant for the following course:

MSC7000Y – Regenerative Medicine

Duties

MSC7000Y is a unique course of wide interest that will provide an understanding of the science behind the regenerative medicine field, new and emerging technologies, and the ethical and regulatory aspects of implementation. Course themes are: Organ Failure, Regenerative Medicine and Innovative Technologies, Stem Cells, Clinical Applications of Regenerative Medicine, Ethics and Society.

The TA candidate will have successfully completed the MSC7000Y course. TA candidates will possess a strong science background in the field of regenerative medicine and awareness of course objectives to the satisfaction of the course director.

The teaching assistant will assist the course director and education coordinator throughout the term in conjunction with the current teaching assistant. TA duties will include managing student email correspondence, reviewing and uploading lecture notes, marking assignments and exams, coordinating journal clubs, and tabulating marks.
